GIRL SCOUTS OF HISTORIC GEORGIA



Girl Scouts Partner with Rotarians and Girl Guides for Girl Empowerment Project In April, Girl Scouts of Historic Georgia, Rotary Clubs from Districts 6910 and 7020, and the Bahama Association of Girl Guides partnered together for an amazing girl empowerment project to support Rotary International's effort to Create Hope in the World.

As part of the project, Girl Scouts and local Rotarians led the effort to collect materials and sew reusable sanitary napkins for girls who have limited access to resources. They had the incredible opportunity to deliver those resources to the Bahamas, where they worked with local Rotarians and Girl Guides to assemble 384 period hygiene kits, write notes of affirmation, and teach local girls how to sew the reusable pads.

Sustainability.

In addition to the hygiene project, the team worked together to identify and label local vegetation and plant a sunflower garden at one of the Girl Guide camps so that the Girl Guides can enjoy nature for years to come. The memories of international collaboration and service through friendship will last a lifetime. Girl Scouts of Historic Georgia is incredibly grateful for the Rotarians and community partners whose generosity made the project possible.

IFSR CERTIFICATES AND AWARDS FOR YOUR CLUBS TO PRESENT

Editor's Note: All, when sending articles in to us, it is best to give us pictures of the event that show scouts in uniforms and Rotary members, and even better if the Rotary logo is also visible.

On our website, we have <u>certificates</u> that Rotary Clubs can award Scouts and Guides and an <u>award</u> that Rotary Clubs can award a Scout or Guide unit that has performed community service. The IFSR Community Service Award may be awarded by any Rotary Club to a Scout or Guide unit of their choice they wish to recognize for performing community service. The award may be given annually to any Scout or Guide unit by any Rotary Club. Recipients are selected by the Rotary Club.

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award. It is intended to permit Rotary Clubs to recognize Community Service performed by local Scout and/or Guide units.

To help Rotary Clubs create and print the award locally, the IFSR website has a fillable PDF version of the certificate which is easy to fill out:

- 1) Open the form at http://scoutingrotarians.org/downloads/CommunityServiceAward.pdf
- 2) Enter the name of the Scout or Guide unit (such as, Troop 101, Metropolis)
- 3) Enter the name of the Rotary Club (such as Metropolis Rotary Club)
- 4) Enter the date of the Award presentation
- 5) Then print the award or save and print at a print center.

Please notify the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us] of the Scout or Guide Unit Name, Rotary Club Name and Date and a record of the award will be posted on the IFSR Awards webpage.

IFSR-2090 ITALY-SWITZERLAND ROTARY & SCOUT FORUM



A joint Forum between Rotary and Scouts was organized by IFSR-2090 in collaboration with the Rotary District 2090, the Rotary Clubs of Chieti, Italy, and the Italian Catholic Guides and Scouts Movement of Chieti. It took place on Sunday 25 February 2024 in Chieti, Italy. The event was a great success, attracting

participants from various organizations and children from Scout units, creating a valuable opportunity for sharing ideas and projects focused on service, friendship, peace and respect for nature.

The day started with the national anthems and institutional greetings from the Rotary authorities and the Mayor of Chieti Diego Ferrara, the President of the Province Francesco Menna, and the National President of WWF Italy. During the morning, inspirational speeches on service were heard, given by prominent personalities such as Aldo Angelico, Rotary Governor of District 2090, and Fabrizio Marano, Chief Scout of the Association of Italian Catholic Guides and Scouts . Then they moved on to focus on the theme of peace, with the guidance of Paolo Raschiatore, Past Rotary Governor, and continued with an in-depth discussion on nature, lead by Luca Lanari, Regional Secretary of Italian Catholic Adult Scout Movement .

The lunch break was followed by a session dedicated to friendship, opened by Dino Bruno, IFSR National President, with contributions by Francesco Di Fonzo, President of the Scouts of Europe, and Fabrizio Marinelli, Leader Trainer of the National Corps of Italian Scouts and Guides. The dialogue on nature continued with Massimo De Liberato, Governor-Elect of the Rotary District 2090, and Giuseppe Finocchietti, former Chief Scout of the Association of Italian Catholic Guides and Scouts.

A lively debate at 5.50 pm allowed effective interaction between the Rotarians and the young people of the R/S Branch of the Chieti Zone leading to significant reflections that concluded at 6.50 pm. The forum was moderated by Aurelio Bigi, Coordinator of the IFSR District 2090.

This event highlighted the constant commitment of Rotarians and Scouts to promoting universal values and collaborating to build a better world. There is great anticipation to see the initiatives presented during the forum take shape in the coming months. [Ref: Facebook]



CLIFF DOCHTERMAN AWARD



Gordon Plumlee became an Eagle Scout on August 3, 1959, and even though life duties called him away for a short period, the Scouting spirit never left him. Gordon continued his involvement in scouting by joining Troop 287 with his son, G. Scott Plumlee, and in 1990, his son achieved the rank of Eagle Scout.

He continued in leadership positions with Troop 287 as Scoutmaster (SM) for approximately 16 years, changing his position as needs arose to Committee Chair (CC), Committee Member (CM), Merit Badge counselor, Chartered Organization Representative (COR), Executive Officer (EO) as well as being involved with Pack 210 by serving as CC, EO, or COR between 1999-2020. Gordon received the Silver Beaver Award in 1992 for working with BSA and the local community, recognizing his distinguished service to youth. He continued his scouting legacy by earning his Wood Badge beads in 2010. From 2020-2024, he was instrumental in helping start a girl's troop for Troop 287 and has completed over 240 additional training classes or continuing education units.

While serving in scouting, he spent 40 years in service to Rotary, joining the Rotary Club of Killeen in January 1984.
