The Cape Maclear Scout Groups are running part time schooling and day care center activities so the children can supplement their education. Clawson Rotary provide materials to help lessen the burden on this community. The Scouts in Cape Maclear will help in the distribution of the items. Our Rotary Club and local Scouts collected and sent the school supplies, as well as personal protection equipment and sanitation products to protect the children from Covid.

We believe this fulfilled several Rotary International and Scouting goals of promoting peace, fighting disease, providing sanitation and hygiene, saving mothers and children, supporting education, and empowering girls.



This is the first time our Rotary Club and Scout units have done a project like this, and we are proud of the outcome.

IN MEMORIUM—John (Jack) A. Young (75)



Date of Birth: Marietta, Ohio 5/16/1947 Date of Death: Marysville, Ohio 8/20/2022

Long-time Rotarian Jack Young, since 1995, who received the highest award that can be given in Rotary, the “Service above Self” award and the prestigious Scouting Silver Wheel Award for his leadership as the Chair for the Inter-American Region for the Fellowship of Scouting, was recently honored with the silver level of the President’s Volunteer Service Award for his work with ShelterBox USA.

The national award was created in 2003 to recognize those who contribute a significant amount of time to volunteer activities.



Young was nominated by those at ShelterBox, who have worked to provide shelter and supplies to more than 210,000 people in 17 countries affected by natural disaster. Aid comes in the form of family-sized tents and essential tools to repair and rebuild homes, as well as items to use in a shelter, such as cooking sets, solar lights, blankets, and water.

Young said giving back is in his blood, with his family showing him the importance of service as his father was a firefighter and his mother was a secretary of the First Congregational Church in Marietta, Ohio.

He was also on the board of American Nicaragua International Hope and Relief Foundation and has been to Chinnendega, Nicaragua, 11 times and seen children living out of a garbage dump. We don't know what poverty is in the U.S. We go there and deliver shoe boxes, which are the only Christmas presents these kids get. The program was founded by a Rotarian to see if we could help kids get an education. We get a shoebox and fill it with a toy and school supplies. I've been on that board since 2007.

IFSR CERTIFICATES AND AWARDS FOR YOUR CLUBS TO PRESENT

Editor’s Note: All, when sending articles in to us, it is best to give us pictures of the event that show scouts in uniforms and Rotary members, and even better if the Rotary logo is also visible.

On our website, we have [certificates](#) that Rotary Clubs can award Scouts and Guides and an [award](#) that Rotary Clubs can award a Scout or Guide unit that has performed community service. The IFSR Community Service Award may be awarded by any Rotary Club to a Scout or Guide unit of their choice they wish to recognize for performing community service. The award may be given annually to any Scout or Guide unit by any Rotary Club. Recipients are selected by the Rotary Club.

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award. It is intended to permit Rotary Clubs to recognize Community Service performed by local Scout and/or Guide units.

To help Rotary Clubs create and print the award locally, the IFSR website has a fillable PDF version of the certificate which is easy to fill out:

- 1) Open the form at <http://scoutingrotarians.org/downloads/CommunityServiceAward.pdf>
- 2) Enter the name of the Scout or Guide unit (such as, Troop 101, Metropolis)
- 3) Enter the name of the Rotary Club (such as Metropolis Rotary Club)
- 4) Enter the date of the Award presentation
- 5) Then print the award or save and print at a print center.

Please notify the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us] of the Scout or Guide Unit Name, Rotary Club Name and Date and a record of the award will be posted on the IFSR Awards webpage.

SCOUTS DRIVE YOUTH-LED SOLUTIONS FOR POSITIVE CHANGE IN DR CONGO



Every day in Scouting, we [encourage and empower young people to drive positive change in their communities worldwide](#). Ahead of International Youth Day on 12 August, we invite you to discover another remarkable Scout project, which enables youth with the skills to tackle and find innovative solutions to some of the most pressing global challenges facing our world.

Scouts in the Democratic Republic of Congo are tackling country-wide poverty, hunger and unemployment with a brilliant, youth-led solution involving... mushrooms!

This Scout project trains Scouts and other young people to become mushroom producers. They learn to grow nutritious food to supplement their primary diet and that of their families and they can sell any surplus generated to create an income.

This project highlighted in our WORLD SCOUT FOUNDATION 2021 Annual Report is changing lives. Christian Shungu, now an Assistant Scout Trainer and Mushroom Growing Trainer, tells us:

“As a new arrival in Kinshasa and unemployed, I was dependent on family members for my necessities. The mushroom cultivation project rescued me. Today, following training in mushroom production and seed cultivation (mycelium), related activities in our production unit, and training for trainers, I have become integrated into our community and have since trained other young Scouts. We produce mushrooms, market and sell our product. I have an occupation! Mushroom cultivation is not only a good project, but for me it has been a tool for social integration, financial independence, the fight against famine and juvenile delinquency and has helped me to thrive.”

Dear Friends of Scouting in Europe

Summer 2022 has offered hundreds of thousands of Scouts in Europe the possibility to return to what they love most: Scout Camps! Many NSOs took the opportunity to host national Jamborees to celebrate the return of scouting with as many people as possible. Some of you might have been part of the different national Jamborees. Among others, at the national Jamborees of Finland and Sweden FOSE receptions were held and we welcomed new annual and Life Friends. Additionally, we were also able to recruit new friends at the European Scout Conference in Rotterdam. A very big THANK YOU to all of you who recruited new friends and joined us supporting scouting in Europe.



Thanks to your support the ESF was able to fund three different aspects of scouting's response to the war in Ukraine.

- We supported projects in Slovakia, Poland (2) and Czech Republic (2) with 26'500 Euros and are expecting a continued need for support to help those most in need.
- Because of your contribution we were able to finance the participation of over 400 Ukrainian Scouts in summer camps in their respective host countries. We supported 17 different summer camps in the following eight countries: Austria, Czech Republic (5), Denmark, Germany, Lithuania, Portugal, Norway (6) and the UK. You made it possible that Ukrainian Scouts who were forced to flee their country were able to experience the magic of scouting in their host countries.



- The ESF acted as a co-sponsor for NSOs which are taking part in the WOSM partnership with UNICEF providing critical care and support to children and families fleeing the war in Ukraine.



Thank you again for your support. Whether you donate, are a FOSE or convince others to join: Together we can make a difference for individual scouts, scout groups and society as a whole.

BISMARCK ND ROTARY AND SCOUTING

Report to the Governor of North Dakota on the State of Scouting in ND marks its centennial at the Bismarck Rotary Club. On March 9, 2022, a long-time North Dakota ritual sponsored by the Bismarck Rotary Club was repeated for the 100th time. The Honorable Doug Burgum, Governor of the State of North Dakota, received the annual report on the state of Scouting from representatives selected by the Northern Lights Council of the BSA at the noon meeting of the Bismarck Rotary Club.

The ritual began in 1922 before the Northern Lights Council as it exists today was formed. The idea was developed by Bismarck Rotarians who were involved in the newly developed idea of scouting and since then has grown into a tradition of the Bismarck Rotary Club, the Office of the Governor, and the Northern Lights Council of the BSA.

The representatives of scouting are chosen by the Northern Lights Council from scouts all over the Council, but generally from Council Districts in North Dakota, since the present Council represents both North Dakota and Minnesota. The tradition is one of the signature events of the Bismarck Club and has been nurtured by them since it's beginning 100 years ago.

The first Governor of North Dakota to receive the report on Scouting was the Honorable Ragnar Nestos, the 13th Governor of North Dakota, and the first Governor in the US to be elected in a recall election. He had replaced Governor Lynn Frazier, a Democratic NPL incumbent who had lost the recall in the prior year. Governor Nestos, an attorney from Minot, was made an honorary first-class scout during the first annual report on the state of scouting. The Governor returned to Minot after his term, but became a champion of scouting over the years. In 1942, shortly before he passed, the BSA recognized Governor Nestos's dedication to scouting with the Silver Buffalo, the highest honor scouting can award.

Bismarck Rotary can be proud of keeping this tradition alive over the last century, and The connection between Rotary and scouting is as strong as it was then. Thomas J Riley PDG 2011-12
