## BSA Chief Scout Addresses RI Convention

Bob Mazzuca, chief scout executive of the Boy Scouts of America, has been invited to give a keynote address at the 2010 Rotary International Conference taking place in Montreal during the 4th Plenary Session on Wednesday, June 23. Mazzuca's speech will be entitled "Boy Scouts of America and Rotary International: Sharing a mission of leadership," and will examine Scouting's long and treasured history with the Rotary and the importance of the relationship as the BSA looks ahead to its next century. He'll also use the opportunity to highlight how Scouting organizations around the world have made a lasting difference in communities and in the lives of young people because of their ability to work together to advance the greater good. The Chief's appearance before Rotary International is particularly timely, since Rotary is celebrating its 100th year in Canada the same year Scouting is celebrating 100 years of service to youth in America. A reception hosted by BSA is planned for Tuesday, June 22 from 5pm-7pm at the Montreal Marriott Chateau Champlain, 1 Du Canada Place, which is just a couple of blocks away from the Rotary's convention site at Montreal's Bell Centre. The reception will feature an exciting update that could have potential impact on all of Scouting in North America as well as to the international Scouting community. Bob Mazzuca will be joined by Scouts Canada and, by proxy, Scouts Mexico, in announcing a trilateral North American bid to bring the 2019 World Scout Jamboree to the BSA's new National Scouting Center in West Virginia. A decision on the 2019 World Jamboree site is expected in January 2011. During the evening, a short program will provide an overview of this historical effort by BSA, Scouts Canada and Scouts Mexico to bring this global Scouting event to North America.

## Scouting Fellowship Continues to Grow

The International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians includes 845 members from 35 countries. Members are Rotarians who are or have been active members or supporters of the Scout Movement, including national organizations that are members of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) or the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS).

The Objectives of IFSR include the following:

- To encourage and foster the ideal of service by Rotarians to promote the growth and development of the Scout movement.
- To provide opportunities for social and fellowship interaction among IFSR members.
- To give active encouragement to Scouting at local, national and international levels.
- To recognize individuals who have provided exceptionally unique service to Scouting and to Rotary.

## RI President Kenny Active Scouter

Rotary International President John Kenny of Scotland was one of the founders of the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians in 1991. He became the second World Chairman of the Fellowship in 1996. Under his leadership, membership in the fellowship doubled and expanded to 18 countries, including: Australia, New Zealand, Africa, South America, the Philippines, Thailand, Japan and the Mediterranean areas.

## RI President Nominee Ray Klinginsmith

Rotary International President Elect Ray Klinginsmith, who will become the Rotary International President for 2010-11 has a long history with Rotary and Scouting. He has been a Rotarian since 1961. He is a former member of the Executive Board of the Great River Council in Columbia, MO, USA. Ray was presented the Silver Beaver Award for Distinguished Service to youth by his home Boy Scout Council.

## The Cliff Dochterman Award Honoring Service to Rotary & Scouting

The International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians created a distinguished service award to recognize service to Rotary and Scouting. At the same time, the fellowship chose to honor the man who embodies the spirit of the Scout Oath and Law and the Rotary motto, "Service Above Self." As a result, the award was named for past Rotary International President Cliff Dochterman. Cliff has served Rotary and Scouting well. He has been presented the Rotary International Distinguished Service Award and Scouting's Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope and Distinguished Eagle Scout Award. Like many Rotarians, Cliff had his first experience of helping others as a Boy Scout on his own trail to earning the Eagle Scout Award. Cliff was presented the first Cliff Dochterman Award at the Centennial Convention of Rotary International in Chicago in 2005. Since that time, almost 500 awards have been presented around the world. Each Rotary Club and District is authorized to present one award per year. ## In Fond Remembrance Former IFSR President Passes Away

Past president of the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians H. Ted Olson passed away at the age of 81 on April 28, 2010. Ted was a living example of the Rotary motto, "Service above Self," and lived his entire life by that motto. It seems that he intuitively adopted that philosophy as a child before he ever heard of Rotary. Ted never sought, but was pleased to have been presented the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award, the Silver Beaver Award (for distinguished service to youth on a local level), the Silver Buffalo Award (for distinguished service to youth on a national level). He was a Baden Powell Fellow and a member of the Irving (TX, USA) Rotary Club. Ted served as World President of the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians from 2005-06. He was a recipient of the Silver Wheel Award for exceptional service to the fellowship and the Cliff Dochterman Award.

## WAGGGS and IFSR

The World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) and the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians (IFSR) have started discussions about ways of working more closely together. The World Association is looking forward to building a partnership with IFSR, and we have been looking at events we can partner on, such as regional and world conferences. We welcome a review of the IFSR logo to see if it might include WAGGGS emblem to help reflect the role Girl Guiding and Scouting play in supporting the development of girls and young women.

As the largest voluntary movement dedicated to girls and young women in the world, with 10 million Girl Guides and Girl Scouts from 145 countries included in our network, our strength lies in the millions of young people we serve. The World Association aims to engage and empower young women, so that they can make a difference in their communities. We achieve this through developing and delivering non-formal education programmes, creating opportunities for girls and young women to learn and gain new skills and experience; and through the positive values and ethos of Guiding supported by the 1million+ volunteers in the movement.

One of our recent achievements was taking a group of 19 youth delegates from 13 countries to the United Nation's (UN) Climate Change Conference in Copenhagen last December to represent the voice of girls and young women globally. The delegates came from all corners of the globe, including Madagascar, Bolivia, Germany, Hungary, Egypt and Lebanon. Delegates were selected for their expertise on climate change, with all 19 of them developing and running environmental projects in their home countries. They ran events, did 20 interviews, wrote 10 blogs, plus daily updates for the World Association's website – all of which helped them communicate Girl Guides and Girl Scouts' key messages and stance on climate change.

A major priority for us is enabling our members to make a personal commitment to the UN Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), which are eight specific goals, such as end poverty and hunger, that the UN hopes to achieve by 2015. With programmes such as our Global Action Theme (GAT), which is a badge and curriculum linked to the MDGs, we support girls and young women to explore these issues and take an active role in their local communities and beyond. Through our global network, girls worldwide say "together we can change our world".

## North American Scouting Bids for 24th World Scout Jamboree

In a unique move, the 3 Scout Associations that serve North America have joined forces to present a single bid to host the 24th World Scout Jamboree in 2019. Scouts Canada, Scouts Mexico and the Boy Scouts of America are working together on the project. The location would be at the new Bechtel Family Scout Reserve in West Virginia, USA, also known as "The Summit." The Summit is under construction to host future national jamborees for the BSA as well as serve as a permanent high adventure base for Scouts. The Summit consists of 10,600 acres, bordering some 70,000 acres of national park service land. The base will allow white water rafting, hiking, technical rock climbing and much more. The North Americans will present their bid to the 39th World Scout Conference in Covitiba, Brazil in January 2011. They are hoping for unanimous support for the bid and encourage Rotarians to voice their support to their home Scout Associations.
