A RECENT QUERY AND A QUESTION FOR US

This was recently received from a member and it has some thought provoking items for all of us to ponder regarding our place in the scheme of things.

"The younger Scouters are doing everything they can to get rid of the older Scouters in the movement. They want to assume positions of leadership without any prerequisites regarding training, and "doing time (serve as an apprentice) getting ready for the responsibility" of a specific leadership role."

Is this a problem in your area? If so, we would like to hear from you regarding how your local Scouters are facing such situations and any recommendations which might be made concerning a "lessening of standards" and attitudes of "dedication" among our younger leaders today. Is this a sign of the times?

Obviously changes are always taking place, especially in programs like Scouting and Rotary. If things did not change, the programs would stagnate and eventually go out of existence. As B-P intimated early on, Scouting is a MOVEMENT and as such will change as the leaders, members and society grow in experience and in meeting the challenges that face us. All of us may not agree with the changes but must recognize that they are vital in the process as we move to maintain high standards and keep the basic tenets of Scouting.
