

Our Rotary Scouting Fellowship made a large impact at the 2007 World Jamboree in England with a large tent for a display to greet Rotarians from around the Scouting globe and to introduce Scouts and Scouters to what is Rotary. Past IFSR Chair David Judge and wife Christine made all arrangements for the IFSR Exhibit and staffing it – staff included Past IFSR Chair Bud Allison as well. Current IFSR Chair Brian Thiessen also helped sign up many new members and converted many to be a Life Member by the time they left the tent.

Each visitor was invited to fill out information that made a link to a Jamboree Paper Chain that snaked through the tent roof. On the last Jambo day the chain was stretched out to be over 450 yards, over 1/4 mile long! Prince William passed by our tent, with a large entourage (mainly females), and all Scouts were provided with a Rotary Scouting Centennial postcard that featured a B-P drawing and that was mailed around the world.

English Scouting Rotarians, including current IFSR in RIBI Chair Colin Jones, helped man the tent throughout the Jamboree, assisting the Rotary staff members from the Boy Scouts of America serving on the International Service Team (nicknamed with a patch that week as the International Slavery Team). A highlight was a Grand Rotary Dinner with the Mayor of Chelmsford, and the IFSR meeting at the tent.

Character-building; service to country, to others, and to self; teaching leadership skills; and becoming aware of the world around us-these are all incorporated into the programs and activities of each organization. The values expressed in Rotary International's Motto and the Four Way Test greatly parallel those articulated in the Scout Oath, Law, Motto, and Slogan.

In addition, all local Scouting Councils are working to find former scouts that are not connected and involved with the local Scouting movement. If you are former scout alumni, it is time for you to reconnect with the scouting program and re-engage in scouting.

And to wear proudly the IFSR insignia pins, ties, neckerchiefs, scarves to help make others aware of our organization. Without constant infusion of new IFSR members our organization will not be able to achieve its objectives so each person staffing a booth should earnestly and respectfully urge Rotarians to become annual (\$35 to join; \$25 per year thereafter) or Life (\$275) members. Annual members receive the IFSR pin; Life members receive the pin plus a necktie or scarf or neckerchief.
- * Recognitions. Acquaint Rotarians with the Recognitions available through IFSR
- + <u>Scouts/Guides</u> develop an IFSR recognition certificate in each country for local clubs to be able to honor young men and women who achieve the highest recognitions in their national Scout Organizations.
- + <u>Adults</u> the Cliff Dochterman Award that can be presented at District Conferences or other significant Rotary events by the District Governors or their assistants to Rotarians who are actively involved in Scouting/Guiding and Rotary.
- ^ <u>Setting up the Exhibit booth</u>. The location of the Exhibit booth area is typically in the House of Friendship or nearby at a Rotary event, and is available for set up a couple of hours before the area opens for visitors. We need at a minimum one display table and two chairs, plus wall space to display our IFSR banner. Sometimes one must bring table covering and always we need two sided tape, scissors, some clips, sometimes staplers, etc.

IFSR flyers, certificates, the large IFSR banner, samples of neckties/scarves/neckerchiefs will be sent to the location or brought with one of the members. Local Scout units may want to have a flyer or information material also.

The IFSR Exhibit is open for a large part of each day (8 am to 5 pm - hours vary). It is important to try to have enough staff to allow IFSR booth helpers to work a 2 hour shift, then off for an hour or so, then resume - to keep rested and refreshed.

IFSR flyers are available in English and Spanish at this time (working on other languages) - IFSR information flyer which contains a membership application.

~ <u>Avenues of Service flyer</u> which gives examples of joint Rotary and Scouting/Guiding projects that any Rotary Club can use to provide active Scouting support of Rotary and Rotary support of Scouting.

The materials (Newsletters, Dochterman Award applications, etc.) are invitingly displayed so that Rotarians going by can see what the booth is about and feel welcome to take materials, ask questions. Materials should include an IFSR Roster for Rotarians to check and see if they know anyone who is a member.

At each Booth/Exhibit we typically also have order forms so that IFSR members can order additional pins, neckties, neckerchiefs and or scarves. Our Executive Secretary will ship these to the individual after the event.

^ Staffing during the Convention/Conference/Institute/Jamboree.

Your service as an Exhibit Booth IFSR member is the most essential thing you can do in IFSR – informing Rotarians about our purpose and recruiting new members to our organization.

What do Exhibit booth IFSR members wear? Scouting uniforms are always appropriate; at least a Scouting polo shirt or T shirt and neckerchief are helpful to visually create the bridge if one is instead wearing 'business casual' Rotary attire.

It is vital to remember that we are there to <u>sell</u> IFSR to the visitors. We need to generally be on our feet and inviting those coming by to look at the booth materials and answer any questions they have. We need to show personal attention to <u>them</u> - welcome them and make them glad they stopped by the IFSR exhibit. Ask if their Rotary Club is involved yet in supporting Scouting/Guiding? Ask if they are personally involved in Scouting/Guiding? Were they as a youth? Are their children involved? What Rotarians in their Clubs are involved? Does the Club do any joint projects with Scouts or Guides? Do they know other Rotarians who are involved with Scouting/Guiding? Do they know about the Cliff Dochterman Award to recognize Rotarians who are involved?

Remind them of the types of things Rotary Clubs can do with local Scouting units (Avenues of Service flyer). And how Interact and Scouting/Guiding are not in competition – youth can cross register and use Scouting activities to add to their Interact activities - particularly in school break times when Interact often goes dormant for lack of something to do. Show them our <u>Scouting Rotarian</u> newsletter.

IFSR does not "do" projects; we want our members to spend their time and energies supporting local Scouting/Guiding and Rotary projects. Our <u>Scouting Rotarian</u> newsletter may have projects in it which a local Rotary Club or Scout/Guide unit invites others to participate but what we 'do' is encourage every Rotary Club to work with local Scout/Guide units to improve their communities, nation, or the world.

Sincerely invite the person to join you and become a member of our worldwide IFSR fellowship - to help promote the Scouting/Guiding and Rotary partnership. We need them and their ideas to strengthen IFSR. Don't be discouraged by an initial hesitancy – talk more about how vital this linkage is to the peaceful future of our world and they need to be part of that.

Annual membership is \$35 to join and \$25 each year thereafter. Or save money and time and join for life for only \$275 (payment by credit card is preferred). Invite them to consider becoming active in IFSR - as a Rotary District Coordinator (to expand membership within their District) or IFSR spokesman for their community. Invite them to sit in one of the chairs to fill out the membership application. For those who join, give them their IFSR pin and take their picture (their camera or yours) next to our IFSR banner - get a copy for our Newsletter! Life members will be sent the tie/neckerchief or scarf by our Executive Secretary afterwards. And explain they will receive the Scouting Rotarian by email so we need to be sure we are kept up to date on all email changes.

If the person is already a member, have her/him check our Roster to make sure the contact information, and the email address, is correct.

At Scouting Conferences/Conventions it is important to alert Scouts and Scouters of the opportunities in Rotary for youth (Interact and Rotaract) and adults (Rotary Club membership, Peace and Conflict Fellowships, Ambassador scholarships). We can try to match up an interested Scouter with a Rotsry Club in her/his geographical area.

<u>Pins and other items are only available to IFSR members</u>. If they wish to order any item have them either complete the order forms provided or go to our web site and order them.

^ <u>Local Scouters/Guiders</u>. We also encourage participation in our booth by one or more representatives of the local Scouting/Guiding organizations of the state or country of that venue - making the Exhibit/Booth even more interesting to Rotarians in attendance. Be sure they are familiar with this Exhibit Booth information before they staff the exhibit, however, so they too can answer visitors' information.

<u>After the Exhibit closes</u>. The Exhibit booth must then be disassembled. With a couple of exceptions the materials left over may continue to be used by local IFSR members to promote IFSR at District Conferences and with other clubs in their communities.

The exceptions which must be shipped back to our Executive Secretary are

- * the large IFSR banner which is needed for use at other upcoming events.
- * The Cliff Dochterman award ribbon and sample certificate
- * Neckerchiefs, ties, scarves

Whereas it may take a couple of hours to set up the exhibit in an attractive manner, the take down (including preparation for shipping) usually takes no more than half an hour.

Membership application forms and money received must be immediately sent to the Executive Secretary so the new members may be quickly processed and receive our IFSR Scouting Rotarian and other information periodically sent. Remember the credit card information on the applications is confidential and must be carefully protected from unauthorized eyes
