IFSR YOUTH SERVICES AWARD FOR 3RD & 4TH QUARTER OF 2017

The IFSR is dedicated to Service to Youth, and in particular to service to Scout and Guide units. Rotarians have found many ways to serve Scout and Guide units, and they can receive the IFSR Youth Service Award for serving a Scout or Guide unit and having it mentioned in the media, any media outlet.

The IFSR Youth Service Award may be awarded to any Rotary Club that renders service in support of Scout and/or Guide units which is publicized in the media, any media. The IFSR Webmaster may give the awards to a club annually. Recipients are selected from articles posted in media or online. Such articles may be brought to the attention of the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us].

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award and is intended to reward Rotary Clubs who support local Scout and/or Guide Units and have their support publicized in the media or online.

To ensure that the award is available worldwide in a timely manner, it is only distributed electronically. The recipient club will be notified of the award and given instructions on how to download and print the certificate. The award can be downloaded and printed by the club themselves or at a print center.

It is hoped that the example provided by the clubs earning these awards will serve as an example on how Rotary Clubs can become more involved in service to youth and in particular to Scout and Guide units. Hopefully these Rotarians will become more aware of the IFSR and the services it provides to Rotarians in their support of Scout and Guide units. Beaver Rotary Club (PA), Sept., 29, 2017, The Times (award)



IN MEMORIUM - GEORGE HETZEL ATHERHOLT JR & KIM MCLELAND



George Hetzel Atherholt Jr., 99, died Friday, Aug. 25, 2017, at St. Joseph of the Pines, in Southern Pines.

He was the only child of George Hetzel Atherholt and Elizabeth Baker Tyson Atherholt, of Merion Golf Manor, Ardmore, Pa., born March 7, 1918. He was educated at Episcopal Academy, the Haverford School, Blair Academy, and the University of Pittsburgh. He was a four-sport athlete, a former PA State swimming champion, and a New Jersey State backstroke and medley relay swimming champion, and lifeguard on the beaches of Ocean City, N.J.



He began his 37-year metallurgical career as a trainee/laborer in the steel mills of Pittsburgh and Bethlehem. Two years later, he enlisted in the U.S. Army and progressed rapidly to the rank of first sergeant. He was sent overseas to England, where he spent a year, and then he participated in the invasion of Normandy, at Utah Beach. He received a battlefield promotion to the rank of second lieutenant, and then spent the balance of the war in France, Holland, Germany and Austria.

At the conclusion of the war, he returned home to the Philadelphia area and continued his career in the steel industry with Edgcomb Steel Company. He joined the Pennsylvania National Guard, and was returned to the Army as captain during the Korean War.

When that war was over, he resumed employment in the steel industry at Edgcomb Steel and moved to Lancaster, Pa., serving in sales for eight years. He was then moved to the Philadelphia plant, where he considered an early retirement. However, he accepted a two-year assignment as vice president of New England operations for industrial service centers before his final retirement.

George was an inveterate volunteer and assumed the position of officer in many of the organizations for which he volunteered, such as the Chamber of Commerce, United Way, Steel Club of Baltimore, Salvation Army, Industrial Development Authority and VP of the YMCA, as well as Junior Achievement, Red Cross and Cancer Society. He was a board member and/or committee member of the Flying Dutchman Ski Club, Camelback Ski Patrol, Steel Service Center Institute, Susquehanna River Boat Club, American Legion, Lake Naomi Club, and the Sertoma Club. He was a Kentucky Colonel, and officer/member of the N.C. Sons of the Revolution, a Mason, a Shriner, and vice president of Skidaway Island (GA) Residents' Association.

George was a 56-year member of the Rotary International and a Rotary District Governor of Georgia, over the years a member of nine Rotary Clubs, president of two, and the Rotary Governor of Georgia. He was a Rotary group study exchange team leader to Sweden and a commissioner on Rotary legislation to Singapore. Some time ago, he was made an honorary member of the Sandhills Rotary Club of Moore County.

George was a lifelong member of the Boy Scouts of America. He joined when he was 11 years old as a Tenderfoot and advanced through to Life Scout. His greatest disappointment was that he did not advance to Eagle Scout as he was diligently training for the swim trials for the 1936 Olympics which were to be held in Berlin, Germany. In his Scouting past he was a cub master, assistant Scout Master, and Sea Explorer Skipper. He was awarded the Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope, and Order of the Arrow. During his many years as a Scout, he served as Merit Badge counselor, Woodbadge director, and many years on the staff of Philmont, and on several National, Regional Area Councils and Troop Staffs. In 2013 he was named "Distinguished Citizen of the Year" by the Occoneechee Boy Scout Council and recently completed 89 years as a Boy Scout.

For 39 years, George also served as a volunteer at hospitals in Pennsylvania, Georgia, and North Carolina, serving on numerous committees and boards.

A life-long Presbyterian, he was a founder of the Skidaway Island (Georgia) Presbyterian Church and was a devoted member of the Community Presbyterian Church in Pinehurst.

George loved to travel and logged travels to six continents. In an Air-Stream trailer, he and Judy visited 49 states and participated in 31 domestic and overseas Elderhostel trips that took them to Mexico, Central America, the Artic, Antarctic, the Yukon and Alaska, as well as trips to countries of Southeastern Europe and the Far East.



George was a renowned wild big game hunter, conservationist, sharp shooter, trainer and lecturer. He was the first North Carolinian to garner the "Grand Slam Award" of Big Horn Sheep, and most of all the Big Twenty nine North Central American game animals. Many of these species were donated to a youth animal museum, a Boy Scout dining hall, a town library, and a Montana hunting lodge.

Thrice married and widowed twice, George's first wife was Leona Moon Atherholt, a U.S. Army nurse and the mother of their three sons, George Jeffrey Atherholt, of Saratoga, Wyo., Frederick Moon Atherholt (Monique), of Swansboro, and W. Tyson Atherholt (Karyn), of Chester, N.H. His second wife, Judy K. Cornish, an American Airlines stewardess, brought her two children to their marriage, Cynthia Ann Purvis (Daniel), of Indiana, and A. John Cornish, of Colorado. He is survived by his third wife, Sheila Currington Atherholt, of New York City and North Carolina, an active church organist and retired music educator.

Aids to Scouting for NCOs & Men was revised by B-P and reprinted in 1915 especially for the 5th Dragoon Guards and for instructors of military Scouts. His Forward states "The question is how best to set about inculcating moral military qualities into the young soldier. The Russians, who formerly believed in the "machine" theory, have now come round to the individual training, and they effect it by training each man as a Scout. The French Army long ago translated and adopted Aids to Scouting as a textbook for the same purpose. Therefore I hope that this new edition of this little book may be found useful for practical training of the individual at the present juncture, when so many thousands of men are coming forward for the defense of their country." The "Ticket to Life" project (TTL) is a Kenya Scout Association initiative which began more than ten years ago. It is based on a Peer to Peer method using Scouts to interact with homeless children and reintegrate them into society. It does this by welcoming them, if they choose, into Scouting through mentoring, personal development, team spirit, challenge, education, self- exploration and discovery of self-worth and esteem. The program began in Nairobi but quickly spread to 20 other cities and towns in Kenya. Subsequently TTL has crossed international boundaries and reached eight other countries, including The Philippines, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Mongolia, Pakistan, and most recently, Thailand.

Scouts Canada is a Canadian Scouting association providing programs for young people of all genders aged 5 to 26, with the stated aim "to help develop well rounded youth, better prepared for success in the world.". [9]Scouts Canada, in affiliation with the French-language Association des Scouts du Canada, is a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM). 2015-16 youth membership stands at 61,438

Scouts Canada's programs are co-educational and it states it is committed to diversity. Scouts Canada has a policy not to discriminate for reasons of gender, culture, religious belief or sexual orientation. Although Scouts Canada's principles requires a basic spiritual belief, it states that members are not required to subscribe to a religion or belief in God.

A branch of The Boy Scouts Association was established in Canada under UK's The Boy Scouts Association's Overseas Department. The Canadian General Council of The Boy Scouts Association was incorporated by an Act of the Canadian Parliament on June 12, 1914. The Canadian General Council continued to be represented internationally by The Boy Scouts Association of the UK until 30 October 1946, when the Canadian General Council became a direct member of the Boy Scout World Conference, now WOSM. Canada continued to be a branch of The Scout Association of the United Kingdom until 2007. In 2007, the organization's name was amended to Scouts Canada. In 1972, Scouts Canada began accepting female participants as part of its Rover Section. This was expanded in 1984 to include the Venturer Section. In 1992, co-ed Scouting was an option for all program sections and became policy for all sections in 1998. Under the WOSM's constitution, only one organization is recognized in each country. Canada is the only country in which this recognition is held jointly. Many other countries also have more than one Scouting organization and some of these have formed national federations which are the WOSM members. Scouts Canada and L'Association des Scouts du Canada send a joint delegation to meetings of the WOSM.

People fear the unknown and fear making mistakes, creating barriers to positive change around the world. For Scouts - the world's greatest change-makers - this is not a problem, because when faced with a challenge they do what they do best - they lead. When thousands of refugee children started settling in Sweden fleeing war, violence and danger, Scouts up and down the country started to ask themselves this question: What can I do to help? Letting their values based leadership take control, Scouts quickly admitted that they are not experts in crisis management or infant psychology, and that they cannot process these 'newly arrived' citizens, but they can offer something extremely valuable, something the other actors in society cannot offer, 110 years of experience, youth development and of creating community leaders through the simplicity of learning by doing. In one word, they can offer Scouting!
