PAST RI PRESIDENT CLIFFORD L DOCHTERMAN DIES



Clifford L. Dochterman, a past Rotary International president and university administrator, died on 23 November 2021. He was 95.

Dochterman, who was known for his lively sense of humor, ready smile, and positive outlook on life, served as RI president in 1992-93. An accomplished public speaker, he was recognized around the world as one of the premier spokespersons for Rotary.

Dochterman retired in 1990 after more than 40 years in higher education administration, includ-

ing 20 years at the University of California, Berkeley, and almost two decades as executive vice president of the University of the Pacific in Stockton, California, USA.

Cliff earned the Eagle Scout award in 1939 in the Central Ohio Council just before he reached his 14th birthday. He was President of the 49er Council (now the Greater Yosemite Council) from about 1975 to 1980. His son is also an Eagle Scout. Cliff was Camp Chief for the Western Region at the 1981 National Scout Jamboree at Fort A.P. Hill in Virginia and Assistant Chief at the 1977 Jamboree at Moraine State Park in Pennsylvania. He served on the Executive Board and several committees of the Western Region, BSA.

He has been awarded three of the highest honors of the Boy Scouts of America, the Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope (1981) and Distinguished Eagle (1991) awards. Cliff was presented the Silver Wheel award of the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians in 2003.

Cliff also served as president of the Stockton Chamber of Commerce, and chairman of the San Joaquin County Parks and Recreation Commission.

For 45 years, Cliff Dochterman has been a leader in Rotary International. He has served on virtually every committee of Rotary, including Chairman of the original 3-H Committee, the New Horizons Committee, the Dreams of the Future committee, and the Strategic Planning Committee. He most recently served as the Chairman of Rotary's Centennial Operations Committee, which planned the observances of RI's 100th Anniversary events culminating in 2005.

As the world President of Rotary International, he was honored and decorated by the heads of state of many nations for his personal contributions to goodwill and understanding in the world. Rotary International has presented him with its Distinguished Service Award and the Polio Plus Pioneers Award for his humanitarian work throughout the world and his early leadership in creating the Polio Plus program. He is author of the booklet, "The ABCs of Rotary."

From 1993 to 1999 he was a Trustee of The Rotary Foundation, and served as Chairman of The Rotary Foundation during 1997-98. He was chairman of Rotary 2001 Council on Legislation. As world president of Rotary, he created the theme, "Real Happiness Is Helping Others".



In 2005, the IFSR created the Cliff Dochterman Award for Rotarians

serving Scouting. The Award honors former RI President Cliff Dochterman, a devoted Scouter from Moraga, California, USA. Dr. Clifford L. Dochterman was presented with Cliff Dochterman Award Number One by IFSR Chairman David A Judge at RI Chicago Convention 2005.

Dochterman, a member of the Rotary Club of Moraga, California, joined Rotary in 1958. In addition to his term as president, he served as RI vice president and as Rotary Foundation trustee and trustee chair. He served on or chaired a number of committees and was chair of the 2001 Council on Legislation.

Dochterman was married to Dorothy Coset from 1954 until her death in 1987. In 1994, he married Mary Elena Washburn, who died in 2013. He is survived by two children, Claudia and Clifford Jr.; two stepdaughters, Elena and Karen; and six grandchildren.

LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT PDG MARK KRIEBEL



As we welcome a new year and re-dedicate ourselves to "Service Above Self", I am sad to share with you that one of our IFSR Life Members, who was the epitome of "Service Above Self", Past Rotary International President Cliff Dochterman has "Gone Home". A lifelong Scout, Cliff passed away on November 23, 2021 in Stockton, California after a brief illness. Cliff first joined Rotary in Berkely, California in 1958 and served as RI President in 1992-1993.

"My father's motto during the year of his presidency was 'Real Happiness is Helping Others,'" said his daughter Claudia Mennuti, a long-time public-school teacher in Stockton. "That is truly the way he lived his entire life. Rotary was a huge part of life for all of us in the family." Cliff also made Scouting one of his life's priorities, serving in many positions including Council President, Jamboree Camp Chief, and longtime board member of what is now the Golden Gate Area Council, BSA. His Scouting recognitions included the Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope, Distinguished Eagle Scout, and the first IFSR Cliff Dochterman Award.

Cliff generously approved the IFSR using his name and likeness on our recognition of those providing extraordinary service to Rotary and Scouting, as Cliff demonstrated during his 95 years. Just prior to his passing, Cliff was excited to learn the IFSR had awarded the One Thousandth Cliff Dochterman Award! He would hand sign our certificates, and always make himself available for our activities and leaders. Last year he attended the virtual chartering of the Rotary Club of the Friendship Knot, the first Rotary Club comprised entirely of Scouters. Thank you, Cliff, for your life of service to Rotary and Scouting. You will remain in our hearts forever.

I am happy to report that there has been a flurry of activity in IFSR Bangladesh and IFSR Italia! Both countries have seen a dramatic increase in IFSR membership even during the challenges of Covid! Their activities and hard work are very much appreciated and set a high standard for all of us to emulate! As I write this in late January, the Rotary International Convention in Houston is still scheduled to take place June 5 – 8, 2022 in person, and the IFSR will have a booth in the House of Friendship and will also hold our annual meeting. I am sad to report that this week the Boy Scouts of America has canceled their in person National Annual Meeting in San Diego. Many WOSM activities and conferences have also reverted to a virtual format, so flexibility continues to be important in 2022.

As we all deal with the continuing worldwide pandemic, please accept my "Thanks" for all you continue to do to support Scouting and Rotary in many creative ways. We have all learned that "Be Prepared" transcends Scouting and certainly is part of everyone's life in these challenging times. Stay Safe!

IFSR CERTIFICATES AND AWARDS FOR YOUR CLUBS TO PRESENT

Editor's Note: All, when sending articles in to us, it is best to give us pictures of the event that show scouts in uniforms and Rotary members, and even better if the Rotary logo is also visible.

On our website, we have <u>certificates</u> that Rotary Clubs can award Scouts and Guides and an <u>award</u> that Rotary Clubs can award a Scout or Guide unit that has performed community service. The IFSR Community Service Award may be awarded by any Rotary Club to a Scout or Guide unit of their choice they wish to recognize for performing community service. The award may be given annually to any Scout or Guide unit by any Rotary Club. Recipients are selected by the Rotary Club.

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award. It is intended to permit Rotary Clubs to recognize Community Service performed by local Scout and/or Guide units.

To help Rotary Clubs create and print the award locally, the IFSR website has a fillable PDF version of the certificate which is easy to fill out:

1) Open the form at http://scoutingrotarians.org/downloads/CommunityServiceAward.pdf

- 2) Enter the name of the Scout or Guide unit (such as, Troop 101, Metropolis)
- 3) Enter the name of the Rotary Club (such as Metropolis Rotary Club)
- 4) Enter the date of the Award presentation
- 5) Then print the award or save and print at a print center.

Please notify the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us] of the Scout or Guide Unit Name, Rotary Club Name and Date and a record of the award will be posted on the IFSR Awards webpage.
