LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT PDG MARK KRIEBEL WITH ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT MARK MALONEY

Editor's Note: All, this was a rare meeting between two true forces in Scouting and Rotary with this meeting at the World Jamboree of IFSR President PDG Mark Kriebel, a Silver Buffalo Awardee, and RI President Mark Maloney, an honor for IFSR, and a real opportunity to promote a closer relationship between Scouting and Rotary.



The 24th World Scout Jamboree is now history, and I want to share with you some exciting things that took place from July 22 to August 2, 2019 at the Summit Bechtel Reserve outside Beckley, West Virginia.

First, for those of you that were there, I know you'll join me in praising the Jamboree Planning Team, headed by Scott Sorrels from the USA, Omar Lugo from Mexico, and Mike Scott from Canada, for bringing the Scouting World a Jamboree like no other! It had been 50 years since the USA had hosted a World Scout Jamboree, and 35 years since Canada hosted, so this was indeed a once in a lifetime opportunity. This Jamboree featured the full program opportunities only available at a permanent, high adventure facility. Where most World Scout Jamborees are almost strictly social affairs, this Jamboree added the program element, much to the delight of the approximately 36,000 scouts and 9,000 adults. If you add the day visitors, it is likely the Jamboree exceeded 50,000 people!



On Tuesday July 30, Rotary International President Mark Maloney and his aide, Past Director Larry Lunsford, arrived at the Charleston, West Virginia Airport and were taken to the Glade Springs Resort. The evening of July 30th, newly formed Rotary District 7545 sponsored a reception for Mark and Larry and, assisting in the preparations and logistics were IFSR members Carol McCarthy, Beckley, WV Club President Dan McCarthy, and PDG Patty Meehan. I was pleased to attend, and was joined by IFSR International Commissioner PDG Brian Thiessen, and Asian Chair Toby Suzuki.

The next day President Mark and Past Director Larry arrived on site at the Jamboree and enjoyed a VIP tour, which included 3 major highlights: A meeting with Interactors, where these International (Brazil, Canada, Curaçao, Ecuador, Nigeria, Switzerland, USA) participants were able to ask questions of President Mark and receive special patches of his visit. Later, President Mark had lunch with BSA Chief Scout Executive Mike Surbaugh, Commissioner Ellie Morrison (her husband Eddie is a Rotarian), WOSM Secretary General Ahmad Alhendawi, and WOSM Chair Craig Turpie. They discussed strategies to help bring Rotary and Scouting closer together, and to also better support each other in order to strengthen both organizations. From lunch, it was straight to our IFSR World Scout Jamboree meeting, where about 200 Scouting Rotarians heard President Mark speak about his strategies for the upcoming

Rotary year, and his reflections on his Jamboree experience. Everyone attending received a commemorative patch, many gifts were exchanged, and pictures were taken, before Mark and Larry had to leave to catch their afternoon flight.

Mark shared that our IFSR invitation was the first (other than the International Assembly and Convention) on his calendar this year, and he was heading to Japan the next morning – a trip that was scheduled around his World Jamboree visit.



This first ever visit by a serving Rotary President to a World Jamboree will go down in the IFSR history books as a great success, thanks to Dan McCarthy in particular, who thought to ask "Why not invite the President?" Dan, we're all glad you asked that question, as both Rotary and Scouting will positively benefit for years to come.

In July 2008, then-District 7510 began a Scouting Services initiative. We initiated club-level presentations of IFSR/Rotary Certificates of Achievement to young men reaching the rank of Eagle Scout and young women earning the Girl Scout Gold Award. This district included 39 clubs and the initiative rapidly grew, reaching the 600th in-person presentation by 2015.

Today, Rotarians of the consolidated District 7475, with now 86 Rotary Clubs, have surpassed 900 inperson certificate presentations to these extraordinary Scouts! Over 50 Rotary Clubs have made presentations, and our "presenters' roster" now totals 91 Rotarians who have given their personal time to making this happen! *All the best Hal Dume*

SHELTER BOX INTERNATIONAL NOMINATED FOR 2019 NOBEL PEACE PRIZE



Past United States Board member of Shelter Box USA and District 6630 Past District Governor Jack Young has been notified by the Shelter box Office that Shelter Box has been nominated for the second year for the 2019 Nobel Peace Prize. The nomination and recognitions for their humanitarian efforts in areas of extreme conflict throughout the world. According to Jack, just to me nominated is an honor it itself and to be recognized a second year by the committee is even a greater honor of the work that Shelter Box does to help others.

This great acknowledgement for the work that the staff, Rotarians, Rotary Clubs and friends of

Rotary is a tribute to all of those involved. Shelter Box provides much more than material aid - we provide the foundation for recovery and thus stability needed for peace, one family at a time. According to Jack, Shelter Box has been doing this since the year 2000 and has been helping those all over the world.

Every hour, more families, just like yours, lose everything in conflict, their lives torn apart, their homes destroyed, lively hood lost, and family members and brutality taken away. Not only natural disasters take place but fighting leave cities in ruins and when troop storms villages, the families are separated.

As Rotary International official and only project partner, in disaster Relief, this nomination is an example of supporting Rotarians area of focus on promoting peace in the world and at the same time providing basic shelter to families who have lost the basic part and provides that shelter to families and children.

This Nobel Peace Prize nomination reflects the incredible work done by the Shelter Box Staff and volunteers around the world, many of which are Rotarians and those supported them, especially Rotary Clubs. According to Jack Shelter Box has affiliates in 18 different countries in the world and continually sends its volunteers to those who need help.

The work of Shelter Box and its volunteers keeps families and communities together, increasing feelings of stability and works with many global humanitarian agencies including UNHCR, the Red Cross, Amnesty International UNICEF and Médecins Sans Frortieres.

Jack is a past Board member of Shelter USA, and Shelter Box Hall of Fame inductee and has been involved with the organization since 2006. He is grateful for all of the work that Shelter Box has accomplished of helping others throughout the world. Please continue your support of Shelter Box. SECOND QUARTER SERVICE TO YOUTH AWARDS

The IFSR is dedicated to Service to Youth, and in particular to service to Scout and Guide units. Rotarians have found many ways to serve Scout and Guide units. They can receive the IFSR Youth Service Award for serving a Scout or Guide unit and having it mentioned in any media outlet.

The IFSR Youth Service Award may be awarded to any Rotary Club that renders service in support of Scout and/or Guide units which is publicized in the media, any media. The IFSR Webmaster may give the awards to a club annually. Recipients are selected from articles posted in media or online. Such articles may be brought to the attention of the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us].

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award. It is intended to reward Rotary Clubs who support local Scout and/or Guide Units and have their support publicized online.

To ensure that the award is available worldwide in a timely manner, it is only distributed electronically. The recipient club will be notified of the award and given instructions on how to download and print the certificate. The award can be downloaded and printed by the club themselves or at a print center.

It is hoped that the example provided by the clubs earning these awards will serve as an example on how Rotary Clubs can become more involved in service to youth and in particular to Scout and Guide units. Hopefully these Rotarians will become more aware of the IFSR and the services it provides to Rotarians in their support of Scout and Guide units. To help Rotary Clubs create and print the award locally, the IFSR website has a fillable PDF version of the certificate which is easy to fill out:

- 1) Open the form at http://scoutingrotarians.org/downloads/CommunityServiceAward.pdf
- 2) Enter the name of the Scout or Guide unit (such as, Troop 101, Metropolis)
- 3) Enter the name of the Rotary Club (such as Metropolis Rotary Club)
- 4) Enter the date of the Award presentation
- 5) Then print the award or save and print at a print center.

IN MEMORIUM - PDG Marcus B. Crotts

PDG Marcus B. Crotts who died June 8,2019. Rotary Club of Winston-Salem (NC), District 7690. Served District 769 in 1980-1981.

August 6, 1931 - June 8, 2019 Marcus Bowman Crotts, 87, of Winston-Salem, NC, passed away Saturday, June 8, 2019 after battling cancer. He was born in Winston-Salem, NC on August 6, 1931 to Daphne Bowman and Marcus James Crotts. Mark received his bachelor's degree from N.C. State University in 1953 and his master's degree from the University of Illinois in 1956, both in mechanical engineering. During his graduate studies, he met his wife of 62 years, Margo, and was a first lieutenant in the United States Air Force at Chanute Air Force Base. Mark distinguished himself as an outstanding innovator, leader, and advocate for the machine tool and domestic manufacturing industries, and was internationally recognized for his service and contributions to engineering and civic affairs while maintaining high moral values. At the age of 24, he and Charlie Saunders co-founded Crotts & Saunders Engineering, a machine tool distributor. Crotts & Saunders Engineering has since been recognized as one of the most outstanding distributorships in the United States. He retired from Crotts & Saunders Engineering in 2014. His involvement in numerous organizations and institutions was remarkable, including Rotary, SME, AMTDA, NCSE, PENC, NSPE, and many others.



His dedicated membership in Rotary led him to serve as president of the Stratford Rotary Club, chairman of the International Fellowship of Flying Rotarians, and District Governor. Mark and Margo attended 35 Rotary International Conventions and were inducted into the Arch Klumph Society. He received the Service Above Self and Rotarian of the Year awards, among others. Mark served as International Director of the Society of Manufacturing Engineers and received the SME Joseph A. Siegel Award. He was an appointed member of the United States Metric Board for six years by former President Jimmy Carter and confirmed by the U.S. Senate. He served as president for the American Machine Tool Distributors Association and was awarded the 2016 Albert W. Moore Leadership Award. He received Distinguished Engineering Alumni awards from both NC State and University of Illinois. Mark served eight years on the NCSU Board of Trustees and was president of the NC State Alumni Association. He received the Watauga Medal, which recognized his significant service to the university. In addition to his professional and club involvement, Mark was passionate about flying, license plate collecting, and jogging. He was a lifelong member of the First United Church of Christ, where he served in many roles. He was friendly to everyone, beginning with "Where are you from?" which would often spark a wonderful conversation. During his world travels, he would frequently recognize an old friend and warmly greet them with a handshake. His signature look always included a bowtie, and he was known for regularly sending personal notes and articles to family, friends, and associates. He was a man of the highest character, who was truly interesting and interested in everybody. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister Nancy Crotts Withers, his son Van Jackson Crotts, and infant granddaughter Elizabeth Palmer Crotts. He is survived by his wife Margo Jackson Crotts, his daughter Laura Crotts Paschall and her husband Jay of Hickory, NC, daughter-in-law Sally Rogers Crotts of Winston-Salem, NC, cherished grandchildren Marcus Rogers Crotts, Jesse Marvin Paschall IV, and Olivia Catherine Paschall, and special nieces and nephews.
