PDG BRIAN THIESSEN PAST INTERNATIONAL IFSR PRESIDENT SILVER BUFFALO



The Silver Buffalo Award is the BSA's highest recognition for adult volunteers, presented annually to those who give noteworthy national-level service to youth. The award was first presented in 1926; it comes with a red-and-white Silver Buffalo Award medal and a square knot for wear on the uniform. It has been bestowed to the founders of Scouting, professional athletes, business leaders, presidents, musicians and astronauts. In almost 100 years fewer than 800 men and women have been so recognized.

Brian Thiessen, Alamo, Calif., NESA Distinguished Eagle

Scout, attorney

With over 60 years devoted to Scouting, Thiessen was not content just to volunteer locally and nationally, but also served as a Scoutmaster at the World Scout Jamboree in Australia, led Scouts to inter-American camporees and Jamborees in Guatemala and Brazil, and took Scouts to an international encampment in Siberia. Nationally, he has served on national BSA committees and led Scouts on two Philmont treks, to Florida Sea Base, and to Maine's Matagamon. Thiessen has also staffed several National Jamborees and World Scout Jamborees.

As past president of the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians, he has participated in Rotary conferences in the Americas, Asia, Eurasia and Europe, showing Rotarians how they can connect with their local Scouting organizations to better serve their communities. A Second Century Society member, Thiessen is most proud of having received the God and Country Award as an adult. He has been recognized as an Order of the Arrow Distinguished Scoutmaster and a Distinguished Eagle Scout and has received the Silver Beaver, Scouter's Key and Cliff Dochterman awards. He is also a Baden-Powell Fellow and member of the European Scout Foundation, Olave Baden-Powell Society, Africa Scout Foundation and Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Foundation.

He served with the Strategic Air Command in the U.S. Air Force. He has also been named Citizen of the Year twice in his community. An attorney in private practice, Thiessen is the past president of the Contra Costa County Bar Association, was named alumnus of the year in 2000 by the University of California Hastings



College of the Law and previously taught at the John F. Kennedy University College of Law.

SCOUTINGROTARIANS.ORG HAS A NEW LOOK

The new IFSR website, ScoutingRotarians.org is compatible with most mobile devices. It was tested extensively on the smallest iPhone and also on computers with large monitors. The navigation bar at the top stays fixed so you can always jump to



another page or go to the website directory. The upside down 'V' in the menu bar at the top-left takes you to the top of the current page from anywhere on the page. The '3-bar' symbol in the menu bar at top-right takes you to the drop-down menu of pages where you can jump to the page of your choice.

The first page is the Welcome page and, in brief, has the latest and most basic information for newcomers. The Home Page is similar to the Welcome page, but has much more detail.

The last entry on the drop-down menu is the Website Directory which looks like:

IFSR CERTIFICATES AND AWARDS FOR YOUR CLUBS TO PRESENT

On our website, we have <u>certificates</u> that Rotary Clubs can award Scouts and Guides and an <u>award</u> that Rotary Clubs can award a Scout or Guide unit that has performed community service. The IFSR Community Service Award may be awarded by any Rotary Club to a Scout or Guide unit of their choice they wish to recognize for performing community service. The award may be given annually to any Scout or Guide unit by any Rotary Club. Recipients are selected by the Rotary Club.

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award. It is intended to permit Rotary Clubs to recognize Community Service performed by local Scout and/or Guide units.

To help Rotary Clubs create and print the award locally, the IFSR website has a fillable PDF version of the certificate which is easy to fill out:

1) Open the form at http://scoutingrotarians.org/downloads/CommunityServiceAward.pdf

- 2) Enter the name of the Scout or Guide unit (such as, Troop 101, Metropolis)
- 3) Enter the name of the Rotary Club (such as Metropolis Rotary Club)
- 4) Enter the date of the Award presentation
- 5) Then print the award or save and print at a print center.

Please notify the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us] of the Scout or Guide Unit Name, Rotary Club Name and Date and a record of the award will be posted on the IFSR Awards webpage.

EAGLE PROJECT SPONSORED BY ROTARY CLUB OF SPRINGFIELD, VIRGINIA MATTHEW NORSKY BSA TROOP 1131B

(Editor's Note: All, these Eagle projects are terrific ways for Rotary Clubs to get involved with scouting. Let your local troops know that you want to help support the extraordinary efforts made to do these projects.)

On Saturday, June 20, 2020, ECHO (Ecumenical Community Helping Others), a non-profit agency helping the needy in Fairfax County, Virginia, received two tons of donated food as part of a food drive conducted by Life Scout, Mathew Norsky, a youth leader in BSA Troop 1131B. Matthew organized this Eagle Project and he recruited twenty-two scouts from Troop 1131, members of the Patriot Chapter in the Order of the Arrow, and members of other troops in the Patriot District of the National Capital Area Council, BSA. Mathew organized his volunteers into three teams dispatched to two collection points, churches in the area, and to ECHO's warehouse/ headquarters. Personally leading the operation, Mathew went to each location to coordinate activities, insure health and safety compliance due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

Matthew obtained support from seven units in the Patriot District: Pack 873, Pack 1344, Troop 50, Troop 1131, Troop 1344, Troop 1345G, and Troop 1347. The food drive was a great success and took place on a day when the weather included both rain and sunshine. "Together, we made it happen. We did our "Good Turn" that day."

The Rotary Club of Springfield, Virginia, participated in Matthew's Eagle Project and provided direct monetary



support to ECHO.

Three of the adult volunteers at the food drive were both Scout Leaders and Rotarians: Mr. Gary Black, Mr. Mark Blanchard, and Mr. Philip Sternberg. Other Rotarians from the Springfield Rotary Club who provided additional support to ECHO's overall activities include Mr. Wayne Chiles and Mrs. Joan Ledebur.

MEETING SCHEDULES FOR BALANCE OF 2020 UNCERTAIN



WATERBORNE ILLNESSES DROP IN FIVE SOUTH SUDAN SCHOOLS THANKS TO SCOUT INITIATIVE



Only about half the population of South Sudan's capital has access to safe, clean water leaving thousands of people vulnerable to outbreaks of dangerous waterborne diseases like diarrea and cholera. After visiting a primary school in Juba and seeing first-hand the filthy water that children were drinking, Patrick Kilo Evans, 22, decided to do something about it. Funded by the Messengers of Peace Support Fund, Evans' Water for Child project makes sure schools have clean water tanks, and that children and teachers understand the importance of hygiene. It now operates in five schools in Juba and has trained scores of Scouts to educate people about clean water. As a result, Evans says incidences of waterborne illness have dropped sharply. Evans, who started in Scouting in 2002 before South Sudan got its independence, has just been named one of 12 Messengers of Peace Heroes for 2018.



Scouting in Hungary



Magyar Cserkészszövetség the primary national Scouting organization of Hungary, was founded in 1912, and became a member of the WOSM in 1922 and again after the rebirth of Scouting in the country in 1990. In 1909 Hungarian newspapers reported about Scouting in England, and some chapters of Scouting for Boys were published as well. István Kanitz bought Baden-Powell's book Scouting for Boys and started the first unofficial Scout troop with friends. The first official troops were founded in 1910 in schools and Christian youth associations. During World War I Hungarian Scouts cared for the wounded.[7]21 After World War I Scout groups were founded in many schools and the first student Scouting groups appeared. Troops were also founded in factories. In 1922 Teleki Pál, a prime minister, was elected as Chief Scout. Air Scouts were introduced in Hungary and a National Scout Brass Band was founded. Before the end of World War II, the national Hungarian Scouts were ordered to merge with the extremist right-leaning youth organization Hungarista Örszem, but it was never really executed. In 1948, Scouting was officially abolished in Hungary by the Communist regime but it remained nascent underground. In 1989, Scouting was again legalized, and during that year Scouting groups appeared as though spontaneously, surprising many by how quickly it returned. In 1994, after democracy and Scouting was reestablished in Hungary, the community around Gödöllő moved to locate and re-erect a statue commemorating the 1933 World Jamboree held there. With the growth of Scouting in Hungary, changes to the organization include girl membership, who have their own patrols, and the expansion from towns into villages, allowing otherwise isolated children to participate.
