LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT PDG MARK KRIEBEL



As summer turns to Autumn here in the Northern Hemisphere, schools return to session and Scout troops begin another year of building character and life skills for young people lucky enough to be a Scout. As Scouting Rotarians, we know that the Fifth Avenue of Service – Youth Service – is what Scouting is all about, and as the world continues to cope with the Covid pandemic, we Rotarians need to ensure ALL the youth in our communities have access to a quality Scouting program. If your Club is not aligned with or sponsoring a Scout unit, consider reaching out to a local unit to see how your Club can help them. Consider inviting Scouts or Scout leaders to a Club meeting to talk about Scouting. Both Scouting and Rotary share a long history, and you, the IFSR member, is the link between these great organizations. For those of

us in the United States, the Boy Scouts of America remain in bankruptcy with the hope of a successful court resolution before years' end. Rotary Clubs continue to charter BSA Units, and your IFSR leadership has continued to monitor the bankruptcy as it evolves to help the legal staff at Rotary International understand and respond to the challenges of the bankruptcy. Many IFSR members in the United States have inquired about what they can do during this time, and our answer is to continue to support Scouting and give our youth the Scouting experience they deserve. Recently WOSM has had a change in their leadership, and I'm pleased to report that Andy Chapman, a resident of Texas who met with past RI President Mark Maloney at the 2019 World Scout Jamboree, has been elected Chair. Andy participated in the chartering ceremony of the Rotary Club of the Friendship Knot earlier this year, so we hope his new assignment affords Rotary the option of continuing to strengthen it's ties with Scouting! Congratulations to Andy, and a reminder to all that the Rotary Club of the Friendship Knot invites all Scouting Rotarians to pay a visit to their online meetings held Sunday at 12 Noon US Eastern Time. IN MEMORIUM Lieutenant Colonel Russell "Russ" Lloyd Jr., USMC retired



Lieutenant Colonel Russell "Russ" Lloyd Jr., USMC retired is a native of San Diego. He spent many of his early formative years in Coronado, where he attended Coronado High School and was Captain of the swim team, and participated in football and glee club. After graduating high school, Russ enlisted in the United States Marine Corps Reserves in 1951. His passion and commitment for the USMC mission motivated him tap into his full potential, and he was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant upon graduating from Colgate University in 1954. Highlights of LtCol Lloyd's 27 years of distinguished service include his first assignment as a Force Reconnaissance Officer, where he honed many lead-

ership skills that he would later use in combat. Notable service include deployment on the USS FRANKLIN D ROO-SEVELT (CV 42), two Vietnam combat tours with 1st Battalion, 9th Marine Infantry in Vietnam (1965-66) and Senior Advisor Korean Marine Corps (1971-72), and Headquarters Marine Corps in Washington, DC. LtCol Lloyd retired from the Marine Corps in 1977 after his final tour of duty as the Chief of Administration for Headquarters Battalion Marine Corps Development and Education Command in Quantico, VA.

Notable awards include the Legion of Merit with Combat "V", Navy and Marine Corps Medal, Bronze Star with Combat "V", Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with Combat "V", Republic of Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm.

LtCol Lloyd's proudest achievement was earning the Navy Marine Corps medal when he single handedly rescued a family of four from drowning in dangerous surf conditions off the coast of Maine. One of his fondest memories was during his tour as Commanding Officer of the Honor Guard and Director of the Sea School at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in San Diego, where he had the privilege of personally escorting President John F. Kennedy during the ceremonial review of the Honor Guard and leading his men in the pass in review.

Upon retiring from the Marine Corps, LtCol Lloyd redirected his energy, having earning his PhD in Higher Education, and began a second career in the field of Higher Education. He worked for George Washington University then Northern Virginia Community College for several years, then culminated his working career at a local community college near his home.

Throughout his life, LtCol Lloyd has taken pride in serving others. He was active in Scouting, earning Eagle Scout as a youth, then the Silver Beaver Award for 30 years distinguished service as an adult Scout leader. He also was a Rotarian for 32 years, serving as President of his local chapter four times; and received numerous honors including the Cliff Dochterman Award, the International Award, and becoming a Paul Harris Fellow.

Russ retired to Fredericksburg, VA with his wife of 60 years Jean Busch Lloyd. Together they raised five children and rescued numerous Labrador retrievers. He enjoyed the camaraderie of old service buddies, often on Volksmarches; where he hiked all 50 States, 29 capitals, as well as parts of Mexico and Canada.
